Getting Prepared For Your Initial Visit at a Veteran's Health Administration (VHA) ALS Clinic

It is good to prepare ahead of time for your first visit at a VHA clinic. Here are a few questions you may want to ask during your first visit.

Can you tell me about your experience with ALS patients?			
How often will I be expected to come to the clinic in person? Do you offer telehealth visits?			
What tests will be used to measure and track the progression of my ALS?			
How will you explore clinical trials and alternative treatments that may be appropriate for me?			
What type of specialists should I expect to meet with during each visit?			
How do you work with other specialists in the VAMC? Who makes the referral, you or my primary care provider?			
Who should I request durable medical equipment through? When should I put in a request?			
How open are you to designing my care plan based on what my personal values and goals are?			
I understand that ALS progresses differently in each person, and you may not be able to tell me exactly what will happen to my body and when. However, it is important to me to feel prepared. Will you share what I can potentially expect to experience?			
How do you communicate with patients and how often?
