

Checklist of Questions To Ask About Clinical Trials

While there are currently no cures for ALS, there are numerous clinical trials underway right now with the goal of finding safe and effective therapies. Below are some questions to ask your care team to learn more about clinical trials, the associated benefits and risks, and help identify trials that you may be able to participate in. We have also included frequently asked questions answered by other patients and caregivers impacted by ALS. These questions may be answered over a series of visits.

There is often a lot of information to absorb during a clinic visit - take a family member or friend with you who can take notes and ask your care team whether you can record your visit so you can listen to their answers and advice again at a later time.
